Parents are becoming confused because the entire NJ state Department of Education is gaslighting parents into thinking that the new NJ state sex standards are the same as in 2014, or its no big deal.

6- Finally there is the sex **curriculum** that your district will actually use. You can only find this by contacting your superintendent or curriculum director. Some districts will probably try to hide and minimize the materials so you still don't know what they will teach. Other district leaders will completely avoid the standards or have work-arounds so they can shield your child from inapropate content. When your school gives you a large level of detail and samples of exact lesson plans and materials, that's when you know you are getting the truth. Most of the districts are not even going to announce what they will do until the 2nd to last week of August.

Keep in mind that state standards, curriculum, and materials mean all different things. So if you say “curriculum” to your superintendent but you really mean “standards” from the state, they are probably going to use that technicality to avoid your question. In reality, you want to see the MATERIALS that will be provided to your children. That is the only way you will see what they will see.

I linked some articles and did all the research for you because it's not easy to figure out, that is why parents are easily lied to by schools and public officials.

Brush up on the standards. They are arranged below by each grade group, so if it says, “end of the 5th grade” that means anytime between 3rd and 5th.

Did you know?

New standards will teach the following:

Before the End of 2nd Grade (ages 7-8)

GENDER STEREOTYPES:
Discuss the range of ways people express their gender and how gender-role stereotypes may limit behavior.

PARTS OF THE BODY:
Explicit descriptions of **vulva, urethra, vagina, anus, clitoris, nipples and breasts.**

REPRODUCTION:
Provides images of fetuses growing within a human along with various animals in nature and a detailed explanation of a uterus.

Before the End of 5th Grade (ages 10-11)

HORMONES AND SEXUAL DEVELOPMENT:
Explains common human sexual development and the role of hormones (ex. romantic and sexual feelings, masturbation, mood swings, pubertal onset). The lesson also overviews what puberty blockers are and how they stop the impact of naturally occurring hormones for a youth who is transgender.

ORIENTATION AND GENDER IDENTITY:
Differentiates between sexual orientation and gender identity. Described as a feeling of knowing your gender. Normalizes feeling like you are a certain gender while having opposite body parts or feeling like you are both genders.

INTERCOURSE:
Defines sexual intercourse and the cells involved with reproduction (sperm and egg) using an AMAZE video. It also includes a discussion of how pregnancy can happen via other methods as well.

Before the End of 8th Grade (ages 13-14)


PREGNANCY:
Describes pregnancy testing, the signs of pregnancy and pregnancy options, including parenting, **abortion**, and adoption


SEXUAL INTERCOURSE:
Defines **vaginal, oral, and anal sex.**
